Motorised Transport Grant & Cost of Lessons

Where a vehicle is essential for the owner to retain employment, the Health Services Executive, HSE, may pay a grant towards the purchase of a vehicle or adaptations to a vehicle being purchased by a person with a disability, who is 17 years and older, and under 65 years of age.

Others who may qualify are people who run their own business, those who can't drive for one reason or another, and those who aren't necessarily working but who have a severe disability and who live in very isolated areas and need their own vehicle for all their transportation needs.

This is a means tested HSE grant, with a maximum payment of €4,917.

Financial Assistance with the cost of driving.

People with disabilities requiring driving tuition can avail of a discretionary payment to provide financial assistance towards the cost of driving lessons. Applicants should contact their local HSE disability Guidance Office.
